*"I currently train community nurses on spirituality at end of life and spiritual distress and more importantly how to recognise it and how to do a spiritual needs assessment. What I particularly like in the sessions is practical down to earth sentences to use as examples. This is what I have found staff are wanting at a grass roots level."*

There are over 50,000 registered users of e-ELCA and new active users are increasing month on month. Are you one of them?

Did you know:

- e-ELCA has had a new software system since April 2015. If you only used it in the 'early days' you'll be pleasantly surprised
- Five of the top ten most used sessions are about advance care planning
- In a 2015 survey the majority of palliative care workers had not used e-ELCA and many hadn't heard of it.

In this session **Christina Faulk**, the Clinical lead for e-ELCA and **Sarah Russell**, Head of Research and Clinical Innovation for Hospice UK will showcase e-ELCA to help you to navigate the platform and access content relevant to their purposes. Recent developments will be described and what's to come in 2016.

Examples of how individuals and palliative care educators are using the e-ELCA resource will be described and workshop participants will be encouraged to share their success and challenges. Before you come think about:

- How you are using e-ELCA to support implementation of Priorities for Care of the Dying Person, the NICE Guidance on Care of the Dying Adult
- How you are using e-ELCA for induction and essential for role training
- How you think you may want to use-ELCA more in your teaching (accredited, bedside, courses and study days).

- To learn 3 things about e-ELCA/e-learning for health you didn't already know
- To help shape the future direction of e-ELCA
