

The 11th Palliative Care Congress

Submission Guidelines for Clinical Innovation & Audit Papers

- Abstracts are invited which are applicable to a wide audience and need to demonstrate:
 - transferability of the concept/project
 - innovation
 - cost effectiveness and benefits to practice/care, e.g. staff support, carers service.

They should be of interest to a multi-disciplinary and multi-professional audience

- Abstracts entered under the “Case Studies” theme should also be applicable to a wide audience and need to demonstrate:
 - Relevance
 - Innovation
 - Transferability
- The abstract should be written in English, to a standard suitable for publication in a peer reviewed journal
- The abstract should be a **maximum of 300 words**. Abstracts which do not conform to these criteria will not be accepted
- A structured format should be used where possible, e.g. Background, Aims, Methods, Results and Conclusions
- The abstract should contain sufficient information to allow the quality of the innovation to be judged, i.e. the abstract must contain results. Abstracts with no results will be rejected
- The material should not have previously been published or presented at any other major palliative care meeting
- All abstracts accepted for ‘Clinical Innovation & Audit’ will be presented as posters
- Please follow the layout of the submission form accurately and complete each Author’s address in full. This information will be used for inclusion in a medical journal if your abstract is accepted
 - Please use the following layout when providing organisation details:
 - department
 - hospital/hospice or institution/company name
 - city
 - country
- In the ‘Authors’ section, the name of the presenting Author should be placed in the top box (Author 1). The mailing address for the presenting Author should be provided in the ‘Presenting Author’ section
- There is no limit to the number of abstracts that may be submitted



- Abstracts will be accepted while the Main Call for Papers is open, between Friday 22 May and Friday 25 September 2015
- You will receive an email confirming receipt of your abstract. If you do not receive this email within 24 hours of submitting your abstract please contact kate@compleatconference.co.uk
- The presenting author for each abstract will receive notification of the outcome of their abstract submission, week commencing Monday 9 November 2015
- All accepted 'Clinical Innovation & Audit' abstracts will be published in a palliative care journal. Unless we receive written notification to the contrary, by submitting an abstract you are agreeing to its publication as above
- Submitting Authors are responsible for any errors or omissions in each submitted abstract. Accepted abstracts will not be proof read by a medical professional before publication

- The Palliative Care Congress requires at least one Author from all accepted abstracts to register as a delegate at Congress for at least one day. **You will be required to register online by Friday 8 January 2016** and you will be reminded of this at the time your abstract is confirmed as accepted
- Delegates not registered by Friday 8 January 2016 will not be able to present their poster.
